FINANCIAL AID FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Searching for Scholarships: Online

> iGrad Scholarship Search: Free Through myCharger

Refining Your Search

How to find scholarships that apply to you:

Meet the requirements

Read the qualifications carefully. Do not waste time applying for something you do not qualify for. Pay attention to the scholarships tailored to you. If you're unsure if you meet the qualifications, you can reach out to the organization.

> Do not be afraid to ask

Do not be afraid to ask anyone if they offer a scholarship. The worst that can happen is that they say "no." A company may even consider offering a scholarship in the future!

What qualities make you special?

It may be helpful to think of qualities that are specific to you. These qualities may be a part of the scholarship requirements (details like geography, demographics, athletic skills, artistic skills, leadership skills, etc.). They could also be useful to write about in essays.

Do not forget your affiliations. Are you or have you been a member of a club (professional group/sorority/fraternity), business (gym/bank), or specific group (girl/boy scouts)? What about your family members (Chamber of Commerce/Elks)?

> Be on the lookout for scholarship scams

- Filling out scholarships should cost you time, NOT MONEY! Although some legitimate scholarships charge fees, be wary of what these charges are. Do not pay to fill out scholarship applications.
- Be cautious of guarantees- No service can guarantee you will receive money.
- Do not give out overly personal information
- Get it in writing if you win a scholarship, you should receive a letter on professional letterhead from the organization.
- Do your research if you feel unsure, look it up to see if this is a valid organization or funding agency
- Contest Winner- Be cautious when receiving emails about being a finalist in a contest you never entered or randomly being selected by an international foundation to receive an award. Most organizations will only contact you after you have made an inquiry.
- High Success Rates- The rate is usually based on the percentage of students for whom the organization finds college scholarships.

Tips on Applying for Scholarships

Steps to completing your scholarship applications:

- 1. Organize your applications by deadline dates and requirements
- 2. Read the application to make sure you qualify
- 3. Solicit recommendations
- 4. Review your application to make sure you have included all your scholarship requirements
- 5. Write a scholarship-winning essay
 - Write a generalized essay

- Follow the rules
- Have someone read your essay
- 6. Need Help? You can book an appointment with a Peer Educator through Navigate via the web or download navigate on your mobile device

Get Organized

Ways to stay organized when applying for scholarships:

- > Use our scholarship organizer
- Create a separate folder or envelope for each scholarship (Order them by the Due Date!)
- Make a checklist of required documents for each scholarship: Essays, Recommendation Letters, Transcripts, etc.
- Add all scholarship deadlines to a calendar! Make sure you do not miss the due date!
- ➤ Gather all required documents and put them in the appropriate envelope/folder in the correct order as required by the scholarship agency
- Have a parent, teacher, or counselor check over your application to make sure it is ready to go out!
- ➤ Mail out your scholarship application
